

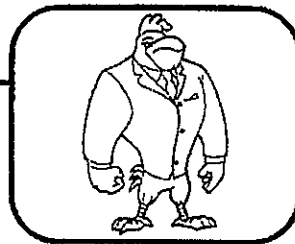

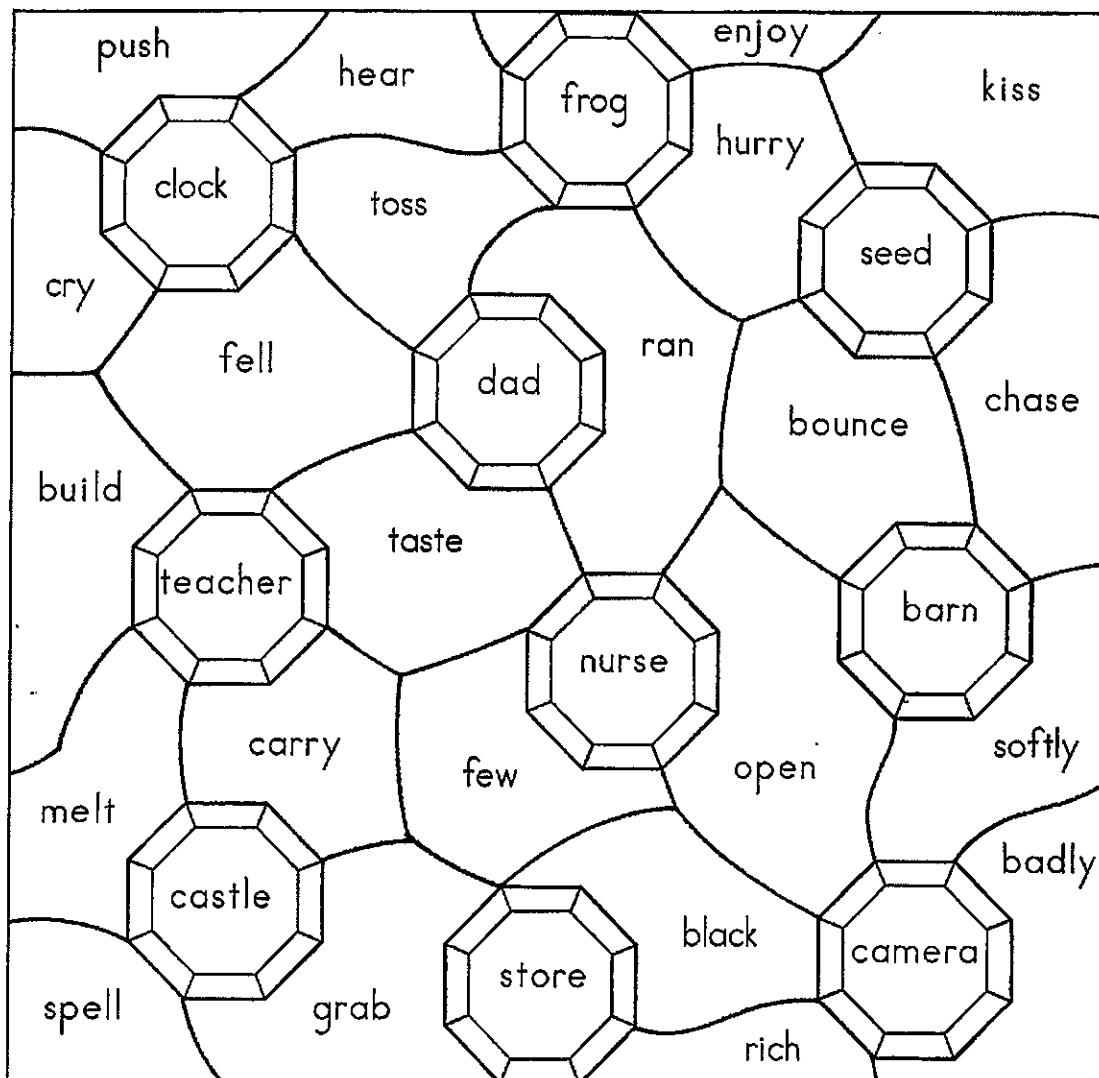
Recognizing nouns

Color the space blue if it names a thing.

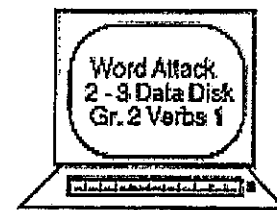
Color the space yellow if it names a place. All of these words are nouns. Now, color the remaining spaces any colors you wish.

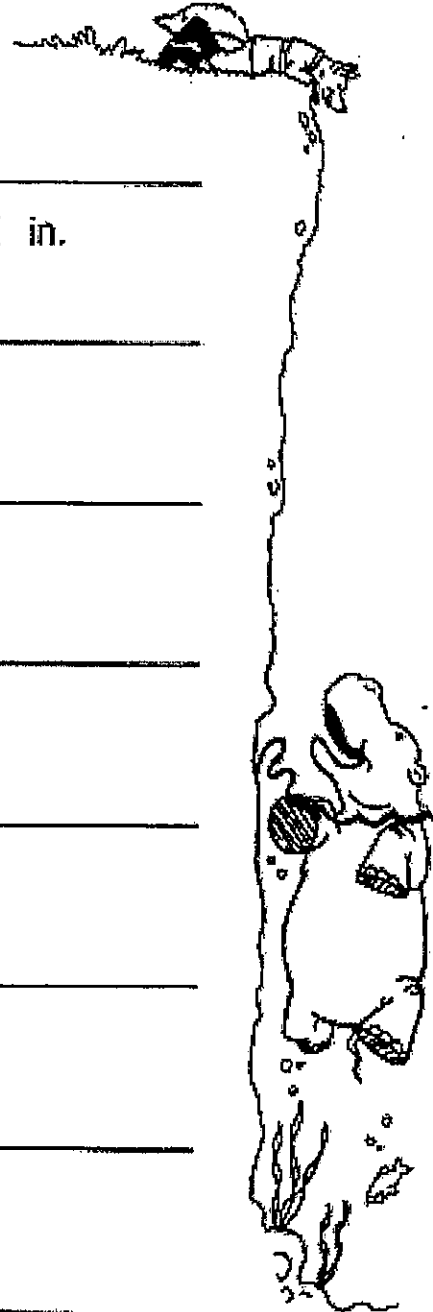

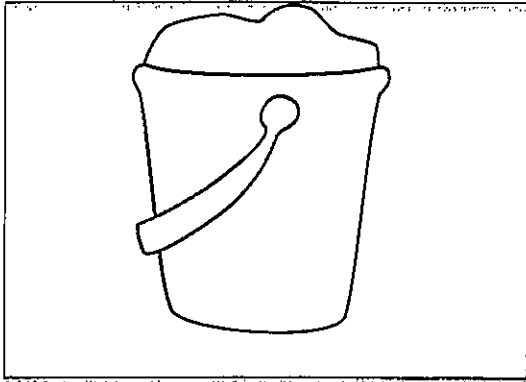
